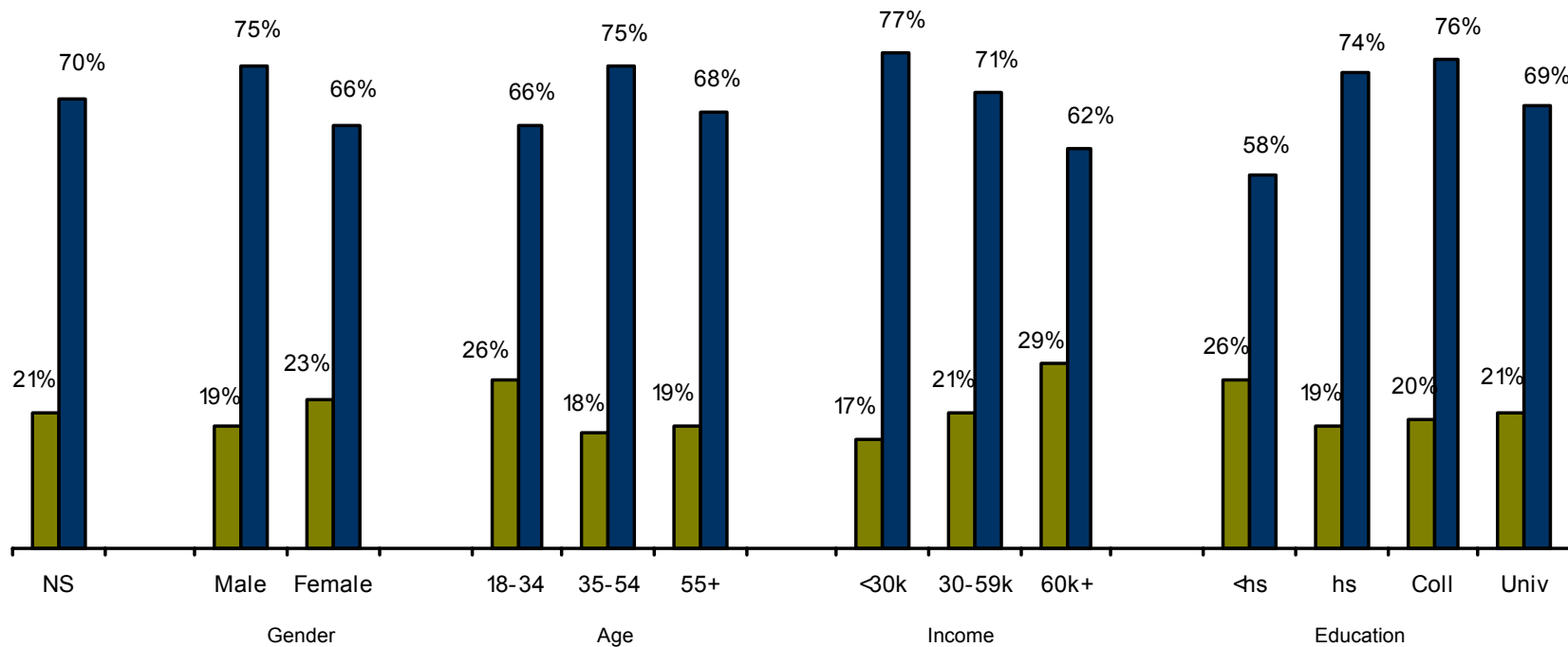

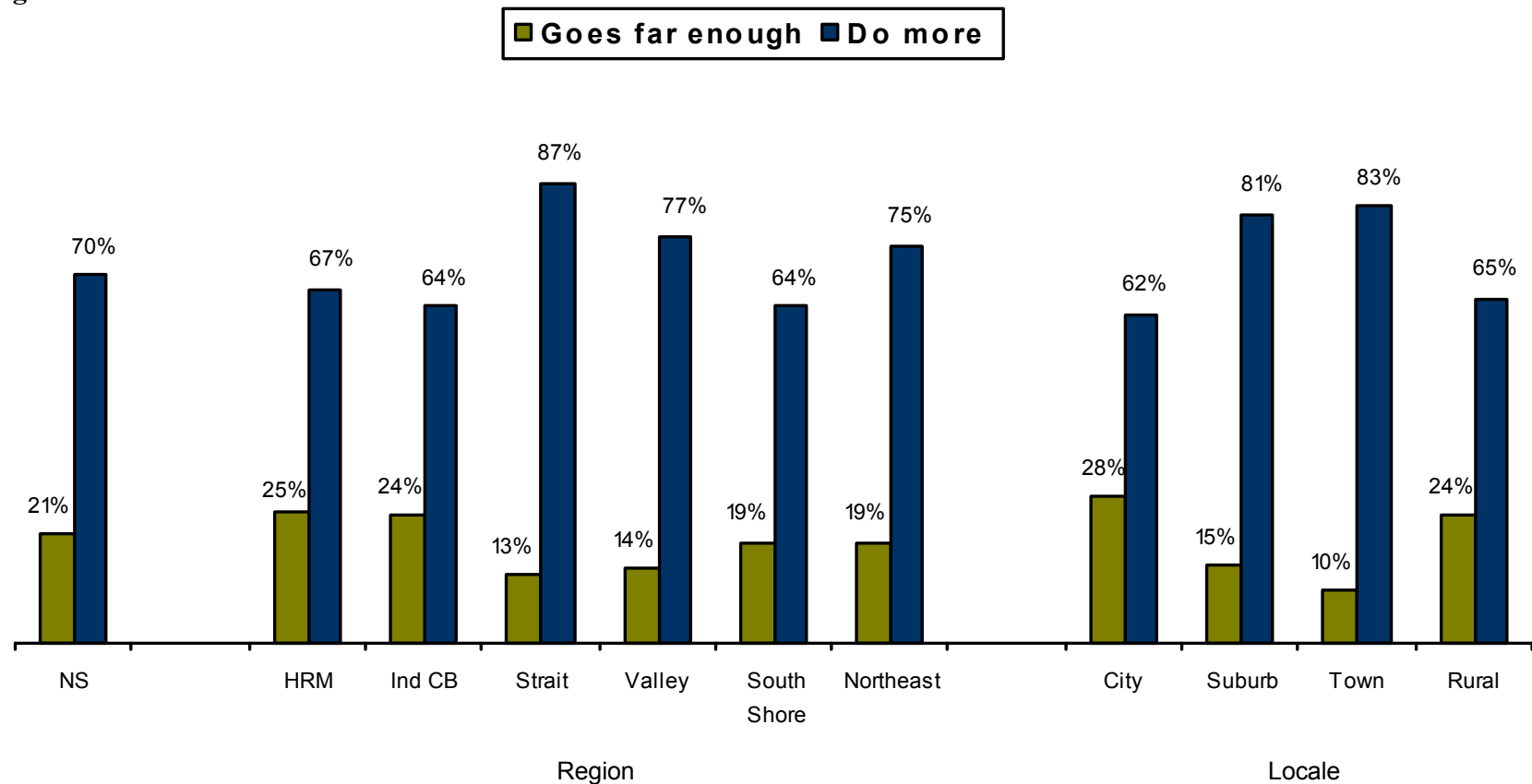

Does the government's VLT plan go far enough? (by geography)

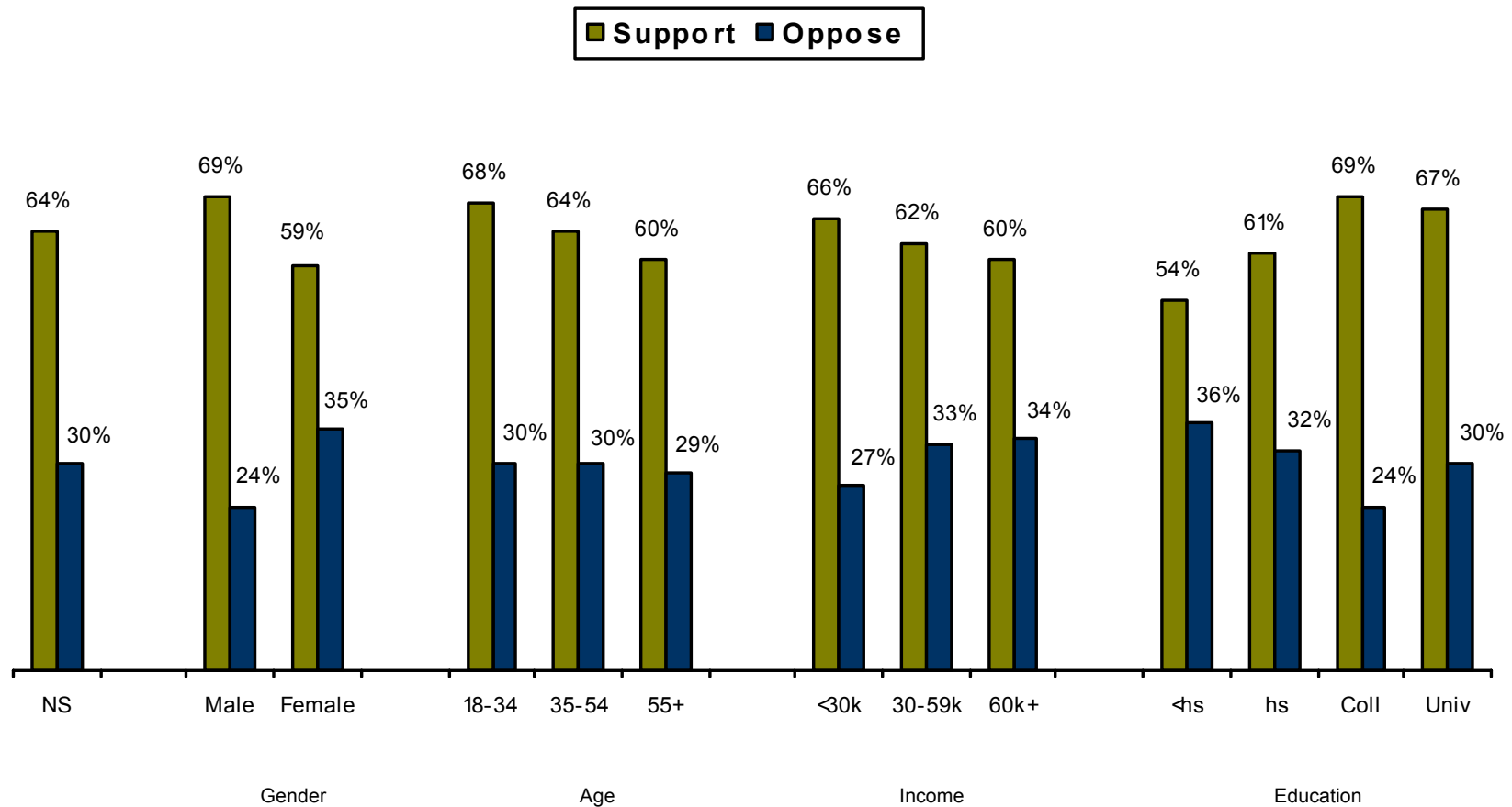
